In 1752, Philip V founded the Royal Academy, inspired by the ones that already existed in Italy and France. Its museum boasts one of the greatest collections of paintings and etchings by Goya, and the Academy also houses various curiosities, including *The Spring* by Giuseppe Arcimboldo.

One of the most magnificent art galleries in the world, The Prado boasts an unrivalled collection of Spanish paintings that includes masterpieces by Goya, Velázquez and El Greco. Allow yourself plenty of time to explore all the rooms in both the neoclassical building designed by Juan de Villanueva and in Rafael Moneo's modern extension, and discover an incredible selection of European artworks from the 12th century right through to the 1800s.

A museum devoted to Madrid's origins, it features a room dedicated to the city's foundation by the Muslims in the 9th century and its subsequent growth as it came to be enclosed by various city walls. Of particular note are the magnificent pieces of Islamic pottery and the remains of the former fortress.

Dürer, Frans Hals, Gauguin, Van Gogh and Kirchner are just some of the great masters on display in the Villahermosa Palace, the large building housing the museum that take us on a journey through seven centuries of European art, from the early 1200s to the late 20th century.

This museum is filled with botanical and insect collections, dinosaur replicas and educational exhibitions focusing on nature.




